

Let us rejoice in the gift of God's grace, freely given, and let that joy spill over into our lives as a witness to others. In a world longing for hope, may we reflect the light of Christ, sharing the good news of salvation with everyone we meet.

Merry Christmas to you and your family! May your celebration be filled with the true joy of Christmas—a joy that comes through faith alone. Amen!

Last month, we examined the historic foundation of the Divine Service, the chief Eucharistic service of the Lutheran Church. This month, we will continue our exploration of music and worship in the Lutheran Church by delving into the topic of psalmody. The Book of Psalms is central to the worship practices of Jewish and Christian communities of faith throughout the world. From their beginnings in the Jewish tradition, to the practices of the early and medieval Christian Church, to the congregational songs of the Protestant Reformation, to the worship services of the present day, the Psalms have most often been characterized by sung, rather than spoken forms. While the musical forms associated with psalmody have changed throughout the centuries, shaped and molded by theological, cultural, and practical considerations, the treatment of the Psalms as a normatively sung form intrinsic to corporate worship has remained remarkably consistent.

For Martin Luther, the Psalms were of critical importance to congregational worship, both in daily prayer services and in the Divine Service. In his "Preface to the Psalter" (1528), Luther writes,

The Psalter ought to be a precious and beloved book, if for no other reason than this: it promises Christ's death and resurrection so clearly...that it might well be called a little Bible...anyone who could not read the whole Bible would here have anyway almost an entire summary of it comprised in one little book.

Given Luther's high view of the importance of psalmody to corporate worship, it is hardly surprising that, in his efforts to craft a body of vernacular hymnody suitable for congregational singing, he placed a particular emphasis on the Psalter. Beginning in the 1520s, Luther proposed to "make German Psalms for the people." These German Psalms were cast in the form of free metrical paraphrases, the meanings of which were to be "as close as possible" to the original language of the Psalms. While Luther called upon other hymnwriters and composers, whom he considered to be more able than himself, to participate in the work of creating a body of German psalmody, he did leave several examples of the genre, crafting hymnic versions of Psalms 12 ("Look down, O Lord, from heaven behold"), 14 ("The mouth of fools doth God confess"), 46 ("A mighty fortress is our God"), 67 ("May God bestow on us His grace"), 124 ("If God were not beside us now"), 128 ("Happy the one who feareth God"), and 130 ("From depths of woe I cry to Thee"). In addition to Luther's congregational chorales that draw from the Psalter for textual inspiration, his sole polyphonic choral composition, Non Moriar, Sed Vivam, a brief Latin motet for four voices, is based on a verse from Psalm 118: "I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord" (Ps. 118:17 ESV).

In next month's article, we will focus on Lutheran psalmody in greater detail, exploring the musical genres employed by Luther and his contemporaries and examining the role that psalmody played in the liturgical renewal of the Lutheran Church in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries. I hope that this series of articles will serve to deepen your knowledge of and appreciation for the rich musical heritage of the Lutheran Church. *Soli Deo Gloria!* ("To God alone be the glory!").

A \$175 non-refundable deposit per person is due by 10/15 or you may pay the full \$395.


A second payment of \$120 is due by December 31.
