And they were able to get moved in before the first snowstorm of the year rather than struggling on their own. There are so many things that the residents are grateful for, and most of us take for granted, like having their own mailbox. Now they can get mail securely. Work is currently underway on another Neighborhood of 9, and all 63 homes are scheduled to be fully occupied by Fall. The Community Center is open and already being enjoyed by residents.



MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS BY JACOB DRENGLER

This month, I would like to return to a favorite theme of mine: congregational singing. While it may seem redundant to revisit a subject that I have explored in numerous previous articles, this is a topic that bears repetition, for the Church's song is central to what we do each week when we are gathered together by the Holy Spirit as a community of believers. My hope for this congregation is that, by engaging in vibrant and enthusiastic congregational singing of the hymns and liturgy, we would welcome guests and visitors to do the same, encouraging and lifting up one another's voices. By giving full-throated voice to the Church's song, we invite the guests in our midst to lift up their voices with confidence.

The Church's song is an integral part of Christian worship, both for the Church on earth and the Church Triumphant. Consider these words from the Communion liturgy: "Therefore, with angels, archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify Your glorious name, evermore praising you and singing Holy, Holy, Holy." When we lift our voices in song, we do not do so alone! We join our voices with believers of all times and places. Indeed, we join our voices, feeble as they may be, with the song of the Church on earth and with that of the very hosts of heaven.

Through the Church's song, we rehearse the story of salvation. Through song, we remember what God has done for us in Christ Jesus. In the Divine Service each week, we sing of God's wondrous, creative, enlivening works. We sing the Incarnation, we sing Christ's Passion, we sing the Resurrection story, we sing the praise of the One who calls us out of darkness into God's marvelous light.

Singing in worship is, like worship itself, both a duty and a delight. We get to sing praises to God. It is a joy to be gathered around Word, font, and table with our sisters and brothers in Christ to receive the gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation that come to us in God's holy Word and the Sacraments. However, in another sense, we *have* to sing praise to God, for it is what God created us to do. The Church's song is intrinsic to our very being, and through God's Word, the words of the liturgy, and the words of the hymns we sing, that song is woven into the fabric of our life together as the Body of Christ. It is all of creation's response to a loving Creator.

So, what does this mean for us in practice? What does it look like for the community of believers at Christ the Redeemer if we are to be a singing church in the best Lutheran tradition? How do we welcome and encourage others to lift up their voices with us? The simplest answer is by singing! When you sing out regardless of how you feel about your individual voice, you encourage those around you to do the same. Many people, particularly those who are new to a community of believers, may fear that they will stick out or sing an unintentional solo, so mumbling the words or abstaining entirely from singing seems the safest option. However, in a community where the singing is strong, it is easier to enter into that song without fear.

Congregational singing is not only for those with melodious voices. It is not only for those who have special musical training or who are members of the choir. It is for all those whose hearts are tuned to the praise of God. So be encouraged to sing! And may your singing encourage your neighbor. The Church's song requires all our voices, that through the Church, the story of God's saving works may continue to be told from generation to generation. Soli Deo Gloria!


